The teams finishing in second place in their respective group 🔑 will qualify for the promotion play-offs, where they will face each other. The winner will play against the 14th placed 🔑 team in 1. divisi on for promotion. The bottom three teams in each group are relegated to 3. divis jon.</p&gt; <p&gt;2. divisjon is &#128273; the highest league a reserve team can partici pate in, and only reserve teams from the Eliteserien clubs (first tier) are &#12 8273; allowed to enter.
