Estudios Churubusco is one of the oldest and largest movie studios in Mexico. It is located in the Churubusco neighborhood of Mexico City.

History [edit]

It was founded in 1929 by Emilio Zúñiga and his wife Feliza. In 1966, the studio was nationalized and became a state-owned enterprise.

During the 1940s and 1950s, the studio produced many of the most popular Mexican films of the Golden Age of Mexican Cinema. Notable films include *Los tres caudillos* (1942), *El indio* (1944), and *El rey del mundo nuevo* (1949).

Other notable studios in Mexico include Estudios Americanos, Estudio San Ángel, and Estudios Tepeyac. The studio was closed in 1988 and later reopened in 2004.

Estudios Churubusco has a long history of producing high-quality films and television shows. It has been the home of many famous Mexican actors and actresses, including María Félix, Pedro Armbrister, and Silvia Pinal.

In 2024, Estudios Churubusco celebrated its 72nd anniversary by

opening the facility to the public for the first time so they could learn more

about the studios and its history. The studio has been a major part of Mexican

cinema for over 70 years and continues to be an important part of the industry.
